On August 11, 2014, at 7:00 P.M., The Richfield City Council held a public hearing for Budget Fiscal Year 2014-2015.

In attendance for the Budget Hearing were Mayor Charles E. Buttcane, Councilman Ron Holland, Councilman Deb Chamberlin, Councilman Danny Ward and Councilman Maureen Ward.

Guest included Ben Holland, Jose Loughmiller, Jason Brauburger, Jama Hamel, Pat Riley and Rex Harding.

No one spoke at the Public Hearing. Mayor Buttcane closed the Public Hearing.

Agenda: 2 Additions to the Agenda (1) H.D. Fowler Meter Presentation (2) Mae Garrett to build a removable garage on city property.

Mayor Charles Buttcane called the regular city council meeting to order at 7:10 P.M.

Agenda: Councilman D. Chamberlin made the motion to add the 2 items to agenda, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman M. Ward. Motion Carried.

Minutes: Councilman R. Holland made the motion to waive the reading and approve the previous months minutes, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman D. Ward. Motion Carried.

Treasurer's Report: Councilman D. Chamberlin made the motion to waive the reading and approve the treasurer's report, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman M. Ward. Motion Carried.

JUB Engineer Rex Harding met with the city council stating the DEQ approved the upgrade on the chlorination for sewer system. The City received a letter from DEQ stating that they had approved the upgrade.

Rex gave the council an update on the Rangen Water Call. A meeting is scheduled October 9, 2014, with city attorneys and representatives of the cities to discuss the water calls.

Web Site: Jama Hamal gave a presentation to the City Officials on the web site that she has been working on for the City of Richfield. She gave suggestions of what could and should be put on the web site and is willing to help the mayor and clerk get it up and running. She will get back with the city council next month.

Budget Hearing for Fiscal Year 2014-2015, Mayor Buttcane asked each councilman if they had any input on the budget that they would like to discuss. No one commented. The City Clerk read the first reading of the Ordinance. Councilman Holland made the motion to approve the first reading, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman Chamberlin. Motion Carried.

Councilman Chamberlin made the motion to suspend the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading of the ordinance, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman M. Ward. Motion Carried.

H.D. Fowlers did not show up to give a meter presentation to the city officials.

Old Fire Siren: Jason explained to the city council that he would like to install the old fire siren that would ring at 12:00 Noon every day. Councilman Holland made the motion to approve the request, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Danny Ward. Motion Carried. This will be done after all other summer projects are completed.

Ben Holland asked the city council about lowering the speed limit to 35 on State Highway 26/93 from Glanbia Inc to the LDS Church. The City Council will contact the State Department of Transportation about doing a study on the speed. Many children are going to the library and cross the highway on Main Street and State Highway 93.

Mae Adams Garrett purchased the property at 110 E. Ada Avenue. She has requested to use city property to place a shed but could be moved easily if need to. The City Council stated that she needed to meet with the Planning and Zoning Commission.

The Richfield School District has asked the City to use city water to water just the football field. The City Council gave the school permission to water one night a week, but only the football field until season is over. Councilman Chamberlin made the motion to approve, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman Holland. Motion Carried.

Pat Riley and Jose Loughmiller from Planning and Zoning met with the City Council to discuss 3 issues that needed to be addressed.

- 1. Foundations
- 2. Domestic Animals
- 3. Appeals Process

Pat Riley discussed with the council having a separate ordinance that pertains to foundations. The Zoning Ordinance covers foundations, but is very vague. Pat will look at the International Building Code to determine whether the city needs to implement a separate ordinance. Pat will report back to the council on the matter.

Domestic Animals: the council at this time would like to not address the animal issues. A conditional use permit could be given on a case by case basis.

Appeals Process: The Planning and Zoning Commission will hear the appeals process first then the city council will hear the appeal. The court system would be the last one to hear the appeal.

Jason has put up new flags at the crossing of Main Street and Highway 26/93.

Bills were read by the City Clerk. Councilman R. Holland made the motion to pay the bills as read, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman D. Chamberlin. Motion Carried.
