

ORDINANCE NO. 196

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RICHFIELD, IDAHO, BANNING THE BURNING OF CERTAIN TRASH WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS, ESTABLISHING EXCEPTIONS AND ESTABLISHING A PENALTY THEREFORE.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHFIELD, IDAHO:

**SECTION 1:** It shall be unlawful to have any open outdoor fires or to burn or cause to be burned any garbage or trash, whether in containers or otherwise, within the boundaries of the city limits of the City of Richfield, except for the following purposes and upon the following conditions:

- a) Open outdoor fires used for the purpose of weed abatement along fence lines, canal banks and ditch banks.
- b) Open outdoor fires used to dispose of tree leaves, yard trimmings and tree limbs.
- c) Contained fires for the burning of paper only.
- d) In any event, no fire shall be allowed to burn past six o'clock p.m. or prior to six o'clock a.m. on any given day. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of an infraction and be punishable by a fine of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).

**SECTION 2:** This ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and publication.
